





- 2011 focus extended to promoting and coming to know the changes of some of the words used at Mass.

Educational Excellence

- Some of our initiatives and priorities for 2011 within the area of Literacy included:
- Continue key teacher in Literacy and in Early Childhood Education
- K& PP teachers trained in Mid West Screening of Communication (SOC) skills.
- Observation Survey Training for new teachers
- Early Intervention in Junior Primary Literacy time



- Book bags for Kindy and Pre-Primary families.
- Focus on Persuasive texts genre
- PD and teacher release to investigate moderating Writing samples to new reporting grades and C descriptors use A-E Grading informed by Department of Education (DoE) standards and student exemplars.

Some of our initiatives and priorities for 2011 within the In the area of Numeracy included:

- Key teachers in Numeracy
- School National Partnership Programme project: investigating Place Value and effectively applying their knowledge and understanding to problem solving'
- Assessment using ENI in place value and counting and whole school profile developed
- Becoming familiar with the Australian Curriculum-Mathematics



- Gender Maths continued
- Targeting Maths –Year 5 &6 classes only
- Mathletics continued due to the success of the programme
- PD: Further Training for staff in Mathletics, Making Maths Resources,

Aboriginal Education

- Focus to ensure that teachers are integrating Aboriginal Studies within the ongoing curriculum
- Ensuring the activities undertaken during NAIDOC week are linked to a deepening of understanding of the Aboriginal culture.
- An Aboriginal Education Plan was developed to ensure the ongoing effective implementation
- St John's was identified as a Closing the Gap Priority school and is receiving further funding



Other Learning Areas

- Re- introduction of Music programme
- Further implementation of Early Years Framework (ECE)
- Continue Cultural Studies throughout the school (PP-6)

3. Achieving to Full Potential

- The chn have been given many opportunities to achieve to their full potential, including sports, choir, art, performing at assemblies, incursions, student leadership committees
- A focus on staff effectively analyzing assessment data to track students progress, identify needs, then design effective learning programmes to assist chn to achieve to their potential
- Staff are given the opportunity to attend a variety of professional development opportunities, as whole staff, teachers, teams and individuals, and to take up a variety of leadership opportunities

4. Community

- Communication and building community with staff and parents continues to be a focus through student diaries, parent teacher meetings, newsletters/letters home, social activities through P&F
- Children are given opportunity to be involved in community projects and activities, e.g. Alice Nannup walk trial and art project(Yr 4), fundraising, parish prayer, Interschool Sporting, incursions and excursions
