





- The All student growth and three others students are performing close to the expected.
- The NAPLAN data for the 2014 Year 3 cohort shows that St John's has achieved expected growth for Reading, as compared to WA Catholic schools.

# Success in primary purpose of increased student achievement

- In Literacy we have performed better than expected compared with similar Catholic education Schools.
- Each year we have valued added beyond the expected average, nearly St1 standard.
- All areas of Literacy show that the school has performed better than expected when tracking cohorts from 2008 – 2014
- Our Easy Mark Reading Assessments show that the Year 4-6 classes are averaging higher than the State average stanine in Reading, as seen below.

#### **Numeracy**

❖Intervention within Numeracy at St John's include the coteaching Mathematics support; MAI and Data to assess and set termly outcomes for identified groups, which are now making positive gains in student achievement.

The average stanine for year 4 and Year 6 are above the State average Stanine of 5.0 and the Year 3 cohort is just below the expected average
