The P&F were successful in acquiring \$909.70 for the school to purchase play and sports equipment for our Early Childhood students. Thank you again to Mrs Jude Darby and Miss Barrett for your collaboration in preparing the Bendigo Bank Community Grant proposal. While we were unsuccessful in receiving any funds the experience was indeed worthwhile. The Bendigo School Banking initiative is proving popular with our students and we will welcome new and existing students to join the incentive in 2018.

It was encouraging to have Theresa McDonnell and Siobhan Allen from PFFWA visit the committee in Term 2. Their assistance in superseding our constitution was appreciated along with their guidance in operating an effective P&F committee. It was also beneficial to hear the shift in emphasis from fund raising to friend raising within school communities prompting the committee to further discussions on the introduction of a P&F levy.

With the decision to run a Christmas raffle thanks to Mr Ian Blayney's generous donation of two bikes we reduced the fundraising emphasis when coordinating the popular Crazy Camel Artwork calendars and books.

Our last fundraising event will be the Plant Sale on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> November. We are very grateful to Mrs Bradley as this is the second plant sale she has coordinated with all proceeds being donated to the P&F.

While major expenditure was exhausted on the Nature Playspace this year, we were able to once again fund the Year 6 Leavers shirts. A market stall and dingy were also purchased for the Early Childhood playground.

The P&F will take guidance from the School Leadership Team and the School Board regarding future projects where P&F funds raised can be best utilised for the benefit of our students.
