Principal's Notes

Staffing

This week, St John's School welcomed Mrs Gayle Mau as a staff member. Gayle will be assisting with the cleaning whilst Mrs Lady Pacheco is on Maternity Leave. Gayle commenced work on Tuesday and I know everyone will make her feel very welcome. Welcome, Gayle.

COVID-19 - Ventilation Update

One of the safety mechanisms schools have been addressing in relation to COVID-19 is ventilation. At St John's School, we have been working as a staff to use fresh air and well-ventilated learning spaces where possible. Prior to the start of the school year, we conducted an internal ventilation audit of all rooms in the school, with a particular focus on doors and windows. Recently, CEWA appointed an external company to undertake a more detailed audit of all learning spaces. I have since received the report from the auditors and I am in the process of addressing the recommendations.

CEWA has also provided St John's School with a carbon dioxide (CO2) monitor. Whilst CO2 is not a direct measure of exposure to COVID-19, CO2 monitors provide the ability to assess ventilation. A high carbon dioxide reading can be used to indicate when actions should be taken to improve ventilation including opening windows or reducing the occupancy in the space. Based on the reading of the CO2 monitor, we are able to gauge if the learning space is adequately ventilated and if not, further open doors and/or windows or increase air con fan speed.

The Staff of St John's School are continuing to work in the best interests of the students in these very challenging times.

Occupational Health and Safety

St John's School endeavours to provide a safe environment for staff, students, parents, carers and visitors. We aim to:

- ensure the safety, health and welfare of all employees and non-employees on school premises
- develop, promote, and maintain a safe and healthy school premises that seeks to minimise the risk of injury or illness for employees and non-employees create a culture of safety that encourages the development, maintenance and promotion of healthy school premises
- ensure that adequate financial, physical and human resources are available to support the management of occupational safety and health on school premises.

If a hazard is observed, that is anything that may result in an injury or harm to the health of a person, we request that it is reported to the School Office in a timely manner. Staff have a form that they are required to complete, students are encouraged to speak to the Staff and parents/carers/visitors are requested to report their concerns to the Office so the hazard can be addressed in a timely manner. Thank you for working with the school to keep everyone safe.

School Jumpers

As you are aware, changes were made a couple of years ago to the rules around the St John's School jumper. The tracksuit jacket is now to be worn with both the school and sports uniform, replacing the woolen school jumper. The woolen jumper is still permitted to be worn as we know this provides extra warmth in Winter.

Project Compassion - Week Two -Biru's Story

Biru lives in a rural village in India. He lost mobility in one of his legs, after contracting polio as a child, which makes it difficult for him to walk. He managed to complete his education until grade six but was always dependent on his parents to get him to school because he was unable to walk so far on his own.

A member of India's Ho ethnic minority population, Biru started to work as a shepherd from a young age, looking after other people's cattle. He continued this work, after he married his wife, Budhni, and had four daughters, even though keeping up with the cattle was a challenge.



Over 26 million people who have a disability in India also live in poverty.

A further 69 percent of the population living with a disability reside in rural areas, which makes access to support services, education and employment an even greater challenge.


