NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing for students in Year Three and Five concluded on Monday 24th March. A big congratulations is extended to all our Year Three and Five students and their teachers for the efforts they have put in so far, the students for trying their hardest and teachers for facilitating the sessions.

A reminder that the NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how students are performing at the time of the test. It is one aspect of the school assessment and reporting process and does not replace the ongoing assessments made by teachers about students' performance.

Individual student reports will be sent home to parents and carers later in the school year when they have been received by the school. These results are reported against proficiency standards. There is a standard for each assessment area at each year level. Proficiency standards provide clear information on student achievement. They are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected of the child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based mainly on what has been taught in previous years of schooling. Student achievement is shown against 4 levels of proficiency: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs Additional Support.

If you are wanting your child to attend Nagle in 2026, could you please ensure you apply before 9 April to guarantee enrolment.
