ROLE OF INDIVIDUAL BOARD MEMBERS

- to attend all School Board meetings and be involved in the decision making process (Board Meetings are held one evening a month)
- · to prepare well for meetings
- to become informed about and develop competence in all matters affecting the School Board
- to provide advice to the Principal with respect to the formulation of school policy that has financial
 implications
- to support the ethos of the Catholic School
- to abide by the Board Code of Ethics
- to assist the Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer as required
- to be a member of sub-committees or other task groups
- to represent the members of the group that nominated you
- to generally, bring to the attention of the School Board any issues or problems in the group or organisation
 which need to be dealt with by the School Board
