#### GERALDTON FLEXIBLE LEARNING CENTRE - an ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL OPTION

As a CARE school Geraldton Flexible Learning Centre (Geraldton Flexi) provides young people from Geraldton the opportunity to engage in secondary education in a supportive learning environment. Our staff aim to build trusting relationships and provide educational pathways for young people who struggle with attendance, are currently disengaged from education, or experience anxiety around attending a large secondary school.

The school achieves its mission through the underpinning of 4 Principles. These are: Respect, Safe and Legal, Participation (having a go) and Honesty. These Principles are used by the young people and the staff, to encourage learning, build personal relationship and resolve conflict.

Enrolment acceptance at the Geraldton Flexi is dependent upon the outcome of an interview, composition of classes and the existing conditions of the current student group. Young people at Geraldton Flexi are empowered to take responsibility for their actions and their learning. When enrolled, young people have the option to eventually transition to mainstream schools or continue through Geraldton Flexi for all of their desired secondary school years.


