Fruit of the Spirit

This week, we once again focus on the Fruit of Love.

'A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.' John 13: 34-35

In the delivery of this new commandment, Jesus completely went against the 'status quo' of the social structure of Palestine. In Jesus' time, people were basically identified by two social classes: the upper social class, who were considered worthy, important, and deserved the privileges that came their way, and the peasant social class, who were ostracised, not considered to be of any worth and received little to no privilege.

For the first time, Jesus created one group whose identifying factor was love. Love crossed over all barriers of social standing. Indeed, we learn later through Jesus' ministry, love should be given in abundance, particularly to those who are vulnerable and on the margins of society.

An adrenaline autoinjector trainer device was used to practice with, ensuring all staff are aware of the correct procedures for administering an EpiPen. We would like to thank our school community for ensuring the school has an action plan if your child/ren have allergies and for assisting us in being an *Allergy Aware School* by refraining from sending any nuts and eggs in lunch boxes. Your awareness and support help to make our school safer for our students with anaphylaxis.

Our training in the management and treatment of asthma also ensures that we are up to date with the correct information and procedures. If your child is asthmatic, please ensure the school has been provided with an action plan and that your child/ren has the appropriate asthma puffer at school.

COVID-19 School Operating Guidelines

COVID-19 Student Positive Result

- Students remain at home until symptoms resolve.
- Register RAT results via WA Health
- Wear a mask if required to leave the home and when accessing public transport (including school transport).
- Avoid large gatherings and crowded, indoor locations. COVID-19 positive persons cannot visit public hospitals and other high risk settings for 7 days.

Close Contacts

A close contact is defined as a person from within the same household or a person who has had household-like contact with a COVID-19 positive person, during that person's infectious period.

- Isolation of close contacts is no longer mandated but close contacts are encouraged to test daily for 5 days and only attend school following a negative RAT result.
- Close contacts may choose to wear a mask.
- Close contacts should register their status as a close contact via the CEWA COVID-19 Self Reporting Portal on the St John's School Website.
- Close contact persons should not attend public hospitals and other high risk settings for 7 days.

Masks

Staff, students and visitors to a school may choose to wear a mask. Staff, students and visitors are expected to adhere to any mask wearing requirements of third-party organisations/workplaces.

Attendance

Consistent with the direction from the Minister of Education, schools are open for learning and students must attend in accordance with the Education Act.

Ventilation

Schools are required to maintain strong ventilation practices, meaning the use of natural and mechanical modes of air flow through classrooms and indoor spaces.

Cleaning

Schools should ensure that cleaning providers utilise detergent and disinfectant agents for high contact surfaces. Consistent and thorough schedules should be maintained throughout the school.

Any is able to be raced as long as it either has 20inch or 24inch wheels. For mini wheelers 12inch balance bike with no cranks.

BMX bike only run rear brakes so if you have front brakes on your bike they will need to be removed. As well as any bells and reflectors removed (these can break during racing and present an injury Hazard.

What to Wear

Helmet: Full-face if racing sprockets and above open face is acceptable for mini wheelers. As long as it is Australian Compliant This is about the only thing you will need to purchase straight away

Clothing: Long Pants and long sleeve shirt that is loose fitting and designed not to rip

Gloves: Any gloves that cover your fingers.
