### Crisis Management Plan (CMP) - Emergency Procedures

Schools are obliged to plan for the safety of those attending their sites. As a consequence of this legal obligation, schools have a duty of care to ensure that all school related activities are conducted safely. In the emergency management context, the duty of care requires that pre-planning be undertaken for emergencies that might affect schools from time to time.

St John's School has a Crisis Management Plan (CMP). The purpose of our CMP is to provide details of how the school will prepare for, respond to and recover from emergency events. The CMP outlines responsibilities, drills and procedures that need to be understood and supported by training.

In the initial stages of an incident, the CMP provides clear and concise guidelines, via an *Immediate Actions Drill*, to enable anyone (staff, students or visitors) to escalate and notify the appropriate authorities of an emergency.

An *Evacuation* may be deemed necessary for a number of reasons, including, but not limited to a fire, chemical spill or a bomb threat. During an evacuation, all persons move to the designated muster point, in most cases our school oval.

A Code Orange/Shelter in Place is enacted when it is safe for the students to continue working in their classrooms but steps need to be made to shield them from witnessing an incident that may cause upset or distress. Examples include, a medical emergency, protester activity, a vicious dog, a snake or a car accident. If students were engaged in an outdoor activity, staff would direct them to move to the nearest suitable classroom.

If there was an active threat, an intruder with a weapon, an imminent danger to the lives of the students and staff, a *Lockdown* would be called. In a Lockdown, learning ceases and students and staff move to a pre-determined location in the classroom, out of the line of sight, and take cover with all doors and windows locked.

At various times throughout the year, we conduct whole school drills, across a variety of situations to ensure all students and staff are familiar with the procedures. All drills are communicated to families in advance.

### **Every Story Every Opportunity**

The moral purpose of St John's School is, 'Every Story Every Opportunity'. At the core of all our decision making, planning, discussions, thoughts, words and actions is the understanding that each individual student of St John's School comes to receive his/her education with a story. It is imperative that we, the staff of St John's School, know these stories so we can provide each individual student with every opportunity to be the best they can be.



### **Child Safe Framework (CSF)**

The wellbeing and safety of all students is the highest priority for all Catholic schools, including St John's School. Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) is committed to child safety and leading and supporting a child safe culture for all our schools, care centres and communities. All members of St John's School are encouraged and supported to make good decisions that always keep the best interests of the child or young person first.

The CEWA Child Safe Framework (CSF) is based on the latest research in child safety for institutions, is in support of best practice, and is consistent with the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse recommendations. A reminder that NAPLAN assessments provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process and does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be issued to parents/carers later in the school year. Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. A result at the national minimum standard indicates that the student has demonstrated the basic literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

# **Child Safe Framework – Key Concepts**

**Extended Guardianship** - When our leaders, staff and wider school community share a collective responsibility to actively support an environment that is engaging, supportive and safe.

**Healthy & Respectful Relationships** - Modelling healthy and respectful relationships creates an engaging, safe and supportive environment. It also assists in equipping, children and young people with discernment of how they should be treated.

**Situational Prevention** - Seeks to reduce opportunities for behaviour that presents risks to students. Evaluating various elements within our schools – including physical and online environments, staffing, governance, behaviours and culture with an aim to eliminate or mitigate situations that present risk for children and young people.

# **Child Safe Framework – Elements**

Support & Healing	Responding to those who have been injured or hurt through abuse and harm and assisting them to heal.
Voice of the Child	Recognising each child and young person's right to be heard and to have a voice in all decisions affecting them.
Culture	All members of the school community share responsibility for, and actively promote an environment that prioritises the best interests of children and young people.
Covernance & Leadership	School leaders create and promote environments that are safe, supportive and engaging. They make their decisions based on the best interests of children and young people.
Policy& Procedures	Having structures and processes that are accessible, consistent and transparent. Policies must be understood, implemented and actioned every day.
Human Resource Practices	Assisting our schools and care centres to identify the most suitable people to work with children and young people, and to provide appropriate training.
Investigating &Reporting	Following, or developing and implementing where required, processes that are transparent, fair and clearly understood by the community
Risk Management	Proactively identifying and limiting potential risks.
Quality Assurance	Improving systematically and continually through ongoing evaluation and assessment.

### **REGISTRATION - Procedures**

- 1. Players will have to pay their fees as part of the process, but it's free for non-players.
