Language learning broadens students' horizons to include the personal, social, and employment opportunities that are increasingly evident in our world today. We are appreciative of the planning that Miss Hewitson applies to preparing the learning opportunities for the students.

This week, Mrs Danyela Payne will participate in online training for ELLA, Early Languages Learning Australia. The ELLA Program centres on building a culture of language and understanding. ELLA is an exciting digital language learning program for our Kindy Class, opening up a world of cultural possibilities for the children. The Kindy Class will be exposed to the Indonesian language using play-based apps called *The Polyglots*. (A polyglot is someone who is multilingual.) They use the apps on tablet devices in the Kindy Classroom. The apps were designed with help from language, early childhood and technology experts. In order to feel **CALM**, we will show self-control and live out the Fruit of the Spirit. When someone isn't feeling **CALM**, we will comfort them when needed.




Feeling JOYFUL
