Principal's Notes

Welcome to Term Four

Welcome back to all our families for Term Four. I hope that you all had a lovely holiday and are ready for the busyness of Term Four. I look forward to seeing most of you on Monday when I return from the Year Six Camp.

Year Six Camp

We are having a wonderful time! We have enjoyed bowling, touring, expanding our scientific, legal and historical knowledge, taking safe risks via the dive towers, flying fox and pool games, just to outline a snippet of our Year Six Camp adventures. The students have represented St John's School extremely well. I know they are looking forward to getting home tomorrow to share all their camp stories when we return to school.

School Hall Air Conditioning

During the holidays, six air conditioning units were installed in the Hall. Catholic Education Western Australia approved the installation of the units in support of the Hall being utilised as the Administration Block, Staffroom, Reading Recovery Room and Uniform Shop during the course of the build. Once the build is complete, the students, staff and wider school community will benefit from the air conditioning in this space.

Student Attendance

- increased academic development
- opportunities for the development of social competence and relationships

<u>Capital Development Plan – Administration and Security Upgrade</u>

A reminder that all parents and carers are asked to read the note that was sent home via Seesaw last term, explaining the school access arrangements whilst the build is in progress. The students were taken on a walk around the school in the last week of Term Three so they are aware of the changes.

I ask all families to be patient whilst the building works are in progress. We have endeavoured to cater for every scenario however, I am aware that there will be surprises that spring up which will call all of us to be flexible. Parents and carers will continue to be notified via Seesaw.

Bell Times Trial – Mondays Term Four

A reminder that this term, on Mondays, we are trialling adjusted bell times. The Term Four Monday bell times will be:

8:30	Classrooms open
8:45	Morning Block commences
10:45	Recess starts
11:05	Middle Block commences

12:55 Lunch starts

1:30 Afternoon Block commences

3:00 Home time

As presented above, there are no changes to the start and finish times. The focus is on reducing the Afternoon Block from two hours to one and a half. The half an hour that has been deducted from the Afternoon Block has been split over the Morning and Middle Blocks with fifteen minutes being added to each block. It is hoped that having slightly longer blocks of time before lunch allows for greater blocks of Literacy and Numeracy teaching where the students are more focused.

Parents/carers are asked to be aware of this time change especially when making appointments and/or dropping off lunches.

After the trial, feedback will be sought from staff and students to determine the arrangements for 2024.


