Nagle Catholic College Sibling Discount

Catholic schools in the Diocese of Geraldton are committed to providing an affordable quality Catholic education for families. We understand the financial demands placed on families and seek to keep the fees as low as possible.

This year, we will continue to have a Kindergarten to Year 12 Sibling Discount for school fees. If any of your children attending St John's School have a sibling currently at Nagle Catholic College, families are eligible for a \$100 family discount off their school fees from St John's School. Families will also be entitled to a further \$100 family discount off their school fees from Nagle Catholic College.

Please note that only one Sibling Discount for school fees is applicable per family. All of the details can be found on the school website <u>https://www.sjr.wa.edu.au/enrolment/</u> at the bottom of the page.

Smoking and Vaping

A reminder that smoking and vaping is not permitted anywhere on the school grounds, including any of the school carparks. This applies to all staff, students, parents/carers, contractors and visitors.

Crisis Management Plan (CMP) - Emergency Procedures

Schools are obliged to plan for the safety of those attending their sites. As a consequence of this legal obligation, schools have a duty of care to ensure that all school related activities are conducted safely. In the emergency management context, the duty of care requires that pre-planning be undertaken for emergencies that might affect schools from time to time.

St John's School has a Crisis Management Plan (CMP). The purpose of our CMP is to provide details of how the school will prepare for, respond to and recover from emergency events. The CMP outlines responsibilities, drills and procedures that need to be understood and supported by training.

In the initial stages of an incident, the CMP provides clear and concise guidelines, via an *Immediate Actions Drill*, to enable anyone (staff, students or visitors) to escalate and notify the appropriate authorities of an emergency.

An *Evacuation* may be deemed necessary for a number of reasons, including, but not limited to a fire, chemical spill or a bomb threat. During an evacuation, all persons move to the designated muster point, in most cases our school oval.

A *Code Orange/Shelter in Place* is enacted when it is safe for the students to continue working in their classrooms but steps need to be made to shield them from witnessing an incident that may cause upset or distress. Examples include, a medical emergency, protester activity, a vicious dog, a snake or a car accident. If students were engaged in an outdoor activity, staff would direct them to move to the nearest suitable classroom.

If there was an active threat, an intruder with a weapon, an imminent danger to the lives of the students and staff, a *Lockdown* would be called. In a lockdown, learning ceases and students and staff move to a pre-determined location in the classroom, out of the line of sight, and take cover with all doors and windows locked.

At various times throughout the year, we conduct whole school drills, across a variety of situations to ensure all students and staff are familiar with the procedures. All drills are communicated to families in advance.

Good News Story

Over the last week, lots of Fruit of the Spirit wrist bands have been given out to the students by staff members. It warms my heart that the students are demonstrating love, joy, patience, peace, self-control, gentleness, kindness, goodness and faithfulness.

Sacrament of Reconciliation


Over the last two weekends, our First Reconciliation Candidates and their parent/carers made their commitment to prepare for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation.
